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Short-Term goals:

- Update and maintain Facebook and Web Site.
- Prepare Email blast, Social Media outreach, press releases, and letters to the editors for below:
  - We are “re-launching” the organization, as we have been without a state coordinator for two years; and we also plan to assist in challenging the RHA.
  - Encourage folks to “Join.” We want to be able to say we have 2,000 members, for example. In return for joining, we can send them a bumper sticker, or coffee cup, or Kristin’s book maybe.
- Contact the pro-life Democratic politicians we are currently aware of and set meetings with them. Find out what their goals are, how we can assist, etc. It will be a listening campaign. Perhaps, too, they will be willing to share names.
- Expand the list of elected Democratic officials we know of who are pro-life.

**The longer-term goals** will depend in part on what the pro-life politicians tell us they need, and in part where we see the majority of membership coming from. In addition to raising money, I would love to eventually advocate for Whole Life legislation, below is one example:

We probably all remember that Title IX said in essence that a college didn’t have to offer women’s sports, but if the school had men’s sports then they had to have comparable women’s sports [if they were to continue receiving government aid]. I would like to advocate for the same idea in housing. I have read statistics that indicate 20 percent of abortions are performed on college women. That’s not a choice, it’s desperation. My argument mirrors Title IX – a college doesn’t have to provide housing. But if it provides housing options for students without children, then it needs to provide housing options for students WITH children [or risk losing government aid].
